Chris Glover – Trustee, Ward 2

- TDSB facing budget shortfall of \$110 million for 2012/13 school year
- in March 2012, Board approved budget cuts totaling \$50.6 million; on June 13th Board will vote on further \$58.2 million in cuts; for more info, see June Board Cuts document attached
- Trustees will attempt to cut those programs/services which will affect the fewest number of students
- imperative that public find out how budget cuts will affect all children, school, staffing, etc. > learn more re global impact of budget cuts; contact school Principal to learn more about how budget cuts will directly affect *your* children, school, staffing, etc.; lobby MPPs for more education \$\$ for all school boards
- NB* recent Drummond report made no mention of revenues, recommended service cuts only

Recommendations ..

- province commission an independent review of education funding (like Rozanski Report, 2002) immediately
- province provide detailed plans showing how they plan to fund Full Day Kindergarten
- province charge all residential land developers an education development fee to help offset cost of building new schools and/or renovating/improving existing schools, etc.; see Ontario Planning Act, Section 37, for more info
- TDSB partner with City of Toronto Parks & Rec to improve school facilities thereby increasing community use of schools

Fears include, but are not limited to ..

- privatization/corporate sponsorship of schools > he who pays the piper, calls the tune; happening in England now; see Guardian website at http://www.guardian.co.uk/education/schoolprivatisation for more info; no place for corporate interference in our schools
- school closures > provincial government definition of "student" very narrow (i.e. does not include adult learners); school utilization rates appear lower than they really are; as a result, province is likely to close more schools
- fundraising/charitable donations > will become essential source of school funding; as ability of school community to fundraise is not universal, inequities will abound

Action to be taken immediately ..

- write letters/sign petitions > all parents/taxpayers need to let elected officials know of their concerns
- peaceful protests > parents/taxpayers organize assemblies outside TDSB, Queen's Park, etc.
- news media/social media (i.e. Facebook, Twitter, etc.) > spread the word; post comments on Twitter at #tdsbcuts
